Simply Put

According to the Merriam-Webster Dictionary, a **predicate** is "the part of a sentence or clause that expresses what is said of the subject and that usually consists of a verb with or without objects, complements, or adverbial."

But, what's a verb?

A **verb** is a word or set of words that shows action, feeling or state of being.

There are different kinds of verbs: action verbs, linking verbs (also called state of being verbs), and helping verbs. It is important, when finding the verb, to include all the helping verbs (sometimes called auxiliary verbs), too.

You are already familiar with action verbs such as swim, dance, paint, think, and many others.
