Greetings BPE Families and Friends,

We are almost done with our 3rd marking period. This means that we are getting ready to come into our home stretch of learning for the year and to begin our state wide assessments in 3rd-5th grades. Now more than ever, your child's time on campus and not missing important instruction due to absences and tardies is vital.

Our team would also like to remind our parents and community members to remain focused on student safety on and around our campus. We know drop-off and pick-up times can be very busy here on campus but please be sure you are following our processes and procedures to make the process as efficient as possible. In order to ensure safety for all, we ask that parents adhere to the following:

- * All students and adults should be wearing masks at all times coming into or leaving campus.
- * Students should be dropped off in the appropriate areas of the school. Please do not drop students off at the Crossing Guard or on the roadways. Do not pull into the parking lot and ask your students to walk through traffic.
- * Do not drive in the bus circle in the front of the school during arrival and dismissal times, this includes our VPK families.

 The buses can't see you and you cannot see the students.
- * Obey the turn signs which prohibit making LEFT turns during posted hours. Right turns only are permitted, during arrival and dismissal times for the safety of the students as well as keeping our traffic flowing out of the car circle.
- * Students should not be dropped off on campus prior to 8:15am and should be picked up no later than 3:15pm.

Finally, we remind all of our students and families that "free dress" only occurs on the first Friday of every month or by a special awarded passes. If we have students arrive out of dress code, we will ask that their families bring them a change of clothes. We thank you for assistance in this matter.

We thank all of our families for continuing to be involved in our school and giving attention to the safety and well-being of all. We appreciate you!

Just a reminder to all our BPE families that our assessment windows are opening. Please be sure that your child has a good night's sleep and a yummy breakfast each day. It is also vital that your child arrive to school on time (prior to the 8:45am bell). FSA testing begins next month-more specific information will be coming but here is the timeline for testing.

New COVID-19 Communication Protocols

NEW COVID-19 COMMUNICATION PROTOCOLS EFFECTIVE FEB. 21

As you may know, the district maintains a dashboard on our website that lists all positive cases in our schools at www.pcsb.org/covid19cases. That dashboard is updated each work day and is searchable by location and date.

Additionally, in an effort to keep everyone overly-informed, principals have been sending out schoolwide messages every time a positive case is confirmed in their school. In many cases this is leading to families receiving multiple calls and emails per week and is causing confusion and message fatigue. We recognize that sending too many messages reduces their effectiveness. We have been asked to simplify the process to ensure families only receive the most essential communications, so we will be updating our protocols moving forward.

Beginning February 21, we will do the following:

- Notify by phone and email any student or staff member who is identified as a direct contact and must quarantine.
- Update the district's COVID Public Dashboard every weekday at noon with cases confirmed the previous day.

Add a link to the district's COVID Dashboard (<u>www.pcsb.org/covid19cases</u>) to the homepage of every school's website.

Beginning February 21, if you do not receive a call, then your student has not been deemed a close contact of a positive case and should attend school normally. If at any time you would like additional information about the number of cases at your student's school, or the safety protocols being followed, we encourage you to submit a question on the Dashboard webpage or reach out to the school principal.

As always, we ask everyone to monitor themselves for any sign of illness. If we all do our part, we can continue to keep our school family healthy and safe.

Attendance Goal: To reduce the number of students missing 10% or


more of school (10% is equal to missing about 2 days of school per month during a school year).

Families may log on to our school's website at www.pcsb.org/baypoint-es to report their child's absence that day. Please see the specific directions and visual displays below.

The top of the website looks like this with the icon on the right.



Click on the icon "Report Student Absence" and it will direct you on how to report your student's absence. The page will look like this (see below). Click on the blue circle and it will create an email to the school directly.



Don't forget to include your student's name, date of birth, grade, date absent and the reason when reporting. It is that easy! No more waiting on the phone to talk to someone.

*Other ways to report an absence include sending a note to your child's teacher in the agenda book or turning in the note directly to our school's DMT (Data Management Technician) in the front office.
