Greetings BPE Families and Friends,

We are fast approaching the end of our 3rd marking period and a time where our focus remains on preparing students for the next grade level. Your child's attendance is vital in making sure that they can be successful and can meet their goals. Every minute counts.

We invite our families to join us for our Student-Led Conference night to get another update on how your child is doing in their own words; what are their goals and what do they need to accomplish before the end of the school year. Then stay for our "Reading Under the Stars". It's a great way to spend a special evening with your scholars.

Our team would also like to remind our parents and community members to remain focused on student safety on and around our campus We know drop-off and pick-up times can be very busy here on campus but please be sure you are following our processes and procedures to make the process as efficient as possible. In order to ensure safety for all, we ask that parents adhere to the following:

- Students should be dropped off in the appropriate areas of the school. Please do not drop students off at the Crossing Guard or on the roadways. Do not pull into the parking lot and ask your students to walk through traffic.
- Do not drive in the bus circle in the front of the school during arrival and dismissal times, this includes our VPK families. The buses can't see you and you cannot see the students.
- Obey the turn signs which prohibit making LEFT turns during posted hours. Right turns only are permitted, during arrival and dismissal times for the safety of the students as well as keeping our traffic flowing out of the car circle.
- Students should not be dropped off on campus prior to 8:15am and should be picked up no later than 3:10pm.

Finally, we remind all of our students and families that "free dress" only occurs on the first Friday of every month or by a special awarded pass. We have had a number of students out of dress code recently each week, including wearing jeans or sweatpants. If we have students arrive out of dress code, we will ask that their families bring them a change of clothes. We thank you for assistance in this matter.

We thank all of our families for continuing to be involved in our school and giving attention to the safety and well-being of all. We appreciate you!





School Restorative Practices Initiative

Restorative Practice is about improvement and restoring our community when harm has been done instead of focusing solely on punitive consequences. We work on choices and chances to do better.

Important Assessment Calendar!!!

Just a reminder to all our BPE families that our assessment windows are opening. Please be sure that your child has a good night's sleep and a yummy breakfast each day. It is also vital that your child arrive to school on time (prior to the 8:45am bell). The testing windows for students are as follows (testing times will vary):

- FSA Writing (4th & 5th grade) April 1st
- FSA ELA (3rd grade)-April 1st & 2nd
- FSA ELA (4th & 5th)- May 5th & 6th
- FSA Math (3rd)- May 7th & 8th
- FSA Math (4th & 5th)- May 12th & 13th
- FSA Science (5th grade)- May 19th & 20th
- Testing this year is paper-based testing.
- * Remember this is a time for students to show what they know. They need to be here to do that!



Attendance Goal: To reduce the number of students missing 10% or


more of school (10% is equal to missing about 2 days of school per month during a school year).

Families may log on to our school's website at www.pcsb.org/baypoint-es to report their child's absence that day. Please see the specific directions and visual displays below.

The top of the website looks like this with the icon on the right.



Click on the icon "Report Student Absence" and it will direct you on how to report your student's absence. The page will look like this (see below). Click on the blue circle and it will create an email to the school directly.



Don't forget to include your student's name, date of birth, grade, date absent and the reason when reporting. It is that easy! No more waiting on the phone to talk to someone.

*Other ways to report an absence include sending a note to your child's teacher in the agenda book or turning in the note directly to our school's DMT (Data Management Technician) in the front office.
