
Every student has Online Home Access to all of our available online programs using the District's Clever portal. Students should use their school username and password to get access. If you have any questions,

Calling all 5th Grade Parents!

As you begin thinking about middle school, don't forget your child's health and well-being! The transition to middle school is a great time for kids to see their doctors for an annual health exam and to review their immunizations. In Florida, one of the vaccines that your child is required to receive in middle school before entering 7th grade is a booster called "Tdap", which stands for Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis vaccine. Tdap vaccine can be given to kids after their 10th birthday. By Florida law, you child will not be permitted to enter or attend the seventh grade without proof of compliance.

The Department of Health and Pinellas County Schools work together to ensure that our students are protected from disease, and we strongly encourage our families to prepare ahead of time! Make an appointment today for your preteen to get the required Tdap vaccine and to update their other vaccinations! Page 3
