Greetings Bay Point Families and Friends.

Where is the time going? We are already into our 2nd marking period and the students are making great progress. We love seeing all the hard work that they are doing focused on reaching mastery of their grade level standards. If you have not already done so, please be sure that you are checking your student's grade in parent portal. This is a great resource for parents not only about their child's grades but also any attendance issues they may be having. This portal will be with your child all the way through high school, so it's great to begin practicing use of it now.

We want to remind all of our families of the importance of attendance. Even a few minutes late impacts your child's day. What may seem like only one day here or there adds up. Students with regular attendance show academic gains greater than their peers who miss even one day a month. It is something simple that has a great impact. A few helpful hints for our families and visitors about attendance:

- 1. If you are picking up your child from school early for an appointment, please be sure that you bring the proper ID and that you do so before 2:15pm. Without the proper ID, even if you are a regular visitor to campus, we will not be able to release your child to you.
- If you are changing your child's going home instructions, please be sure to let your child's teacher know in writing in their planner as well as notifying the front office. We do not take student's words for those changes.
- 3. School starts promptly at 8:45am. If your child is arriving at that time or later, they are considered tardy to school. Please be sure though that your child does not arrive to campus prior to 8:15am as there is no adult supervision until that time.
- 4. If your child is going to be absent from school, please be sure to send a note in to the school and/or use our online absence reporting tool to let us know why (more info available in this newsletter).

Finally, we wanted to ask all of our families' support in making sure that your student is regularly using their CLEVER program to get onto their iReady practice site. This site allows them at-home practice in Reading and Math to help grow their understanding of grade level concepts or supports in areas that they need growth. Each student should be spending at least 45 minutes in Reading and 45 minutes in Math each week. Your child can show you how to check if they are getting their minutes. Also, be sure to check out our last pages to find out what your child's focus is in ELA, Math and Science. Thank you for your support in helping us, help your student grow!

Reporting Absences Online


Attendance Goal: To reduce the number of students missing 10% or more of School (10% is equal to missing about 2 days of school per month during a school year).

Families may log on to our school's website at www.pcsb.org/baypoint-es to report their child's absence that day. Please see the specific directions and visual displays below.

The top of the website looks like this with the icon on the right.



Click on the icon "Report Student Absence" and it will direct you on how to report your student's absence. The page will look like this (see below). Click on the blue circle and it will create an email to the school directly.



Don't forget to include your student's name, date of birth, grade, date absent and the reason when reporting. It is that easy! No more waiting on the phone to talk to someone.

*Other ways to report an absence include sending a note to your child's teacher in the agenda book or turning in the note directly to our schools DMT (Data Management Technician) in the front office.

Olweus Bullying Prevention Program Kicks off at Bay Point Elementary this month!

Bay Point Elementary is an Olweus (ol-vay-us) Bullying Prevention Program school! Bullying is not tolerated here, and we will be educating all students and staff on what is bullying, how everyone can help prevent bullying, how to be an upstander (a helpful bystander), and how to promote kindness. We will be kicking off this prevention program with our students on Nov. 5 with a performance by Corey Thornton!

Bullying IS:

- Repeated
- Or has the potential for being repeated (as in severe cases)
- Intentional
- Deliberate, not accidental or unaware
- Power imbalance

Can be physical or social power imbalance



Students often mistake a peer being rude or mean for bullying. While we discourage rude and mean behavior, it is important to understand the differences.

Rude = when someone is accidentally mean one time

Mean = when someone is purposefully mean one time
