Science Fair May 7th ...Mrs. Vyverberg

It is time to start thinking about our school's science fair, especially if your child is in third, fourth, or fifth grades. The students should start researching a topic that they can investigate. Most are bringing home a paper where they must write a brief summary of what they propose to do. It is recommended that a good starting point is the website ScienceBuddies.org. It has a Topic Selection Wizard that will suggest over 100 projects once a questionnaire is completed. There are of course many other websites as well as books that can be checked out from the school's library or from the public library about various science fair projects.

The fair is May 6th, 7th and 8th. Each individual classroom teacher will assign a due date for when the projects are to be brought to school. Boards will be sold for \$3.00 in the science lab before and after school until mid- April. Please email your child's classroom teacher or me at vyverbergc@pcsb.org if you have any questions.
