Please Promptly Return Your Child's Clinic Card

What if your child is sick, or the bus taking them home in the afternoon is delayed, or the teacher needs to contact you about their progress and we do not have a number to reach you!

Please return the yellow clinic cards with accurate information to help us keep you in touch. And don't forget to keep us updated if your contact information changes during the year.

If you send someone else to pick up your child—that person's name must be on the yellow clinic card before they may take your child home.

Meal Deal

Our cafeteria serves nutritious meals to the students for a nominal fee. Breakfast is \$1.00 and lunch costs \$1.75 a day. Free or reduced cost meals are available to eligible students. Just fill out the forms you receive in your first day packets.

You may wish to put money in an account for your child, that way you do not have to dig for change every day. Get To and From School Safely

THE CAR CIRCLE

Please be extra patient the first week or so of the new school year as many more parents drive their children the first few days than we see on a regular basis. Keep heart—the congestion will not be as bad once the school year gets under way.

The overall process will move smoothly, and safely, if you follow these simple guidelines when dropping off and picking up your child:

- **Post the sign** we provide with your rider(s) name(s) in your windshield. This way we are able to call the children as you arrive.
- **Pull up all the way**—do not stop at the cross walk. This allows more cars into the driveway and cuts down on congestion on 22nd.
- **Double traffic lanes are unsafe** as it is difficult for drivers to see children crossing in between cars—please be patient and wait in a single car lane.
- **Turn right!** Left hand turns slow everything down as drivers cross each other's paths. If possible, enter the school with a right turn off of 22nd Street. Likewise when exiting the school drop off zone, turn right onto 22nd Street toward 54th Avenue.
- **If you must park**, *do not* park in the drive through lanes, please use a parking space.
- **Do not double park** even "for a minute" it blocks others in.
- **Do not drive** in the Bus Circle.
- Use the crosswalk. This sets a standard for the children so that they do not run between cars or buses. If adults act appropriately, the children will be more likely to follow the rules of the road.
- The teachers and staff take turns at the thankless task of traffic duty to insure your child's safety. Please be courteous to them and help them do their job by doing your part to insure the car circle moves safely and quickly.

WALKERS, BIKERS AND BUS RIDERS

Take a moment to review these safety tips with your child:

• Always cross the road at a crosswalk, obey the

Crossing Guards.
Look both ways before crossing a street.

• Do not walk or ride between parked cars or buses. Go to the intersection to cross.

- Wear a bicycle helmet when riding a bike.
- Arrive at the bus stop in time for the bus.
- Do not run to or from the buses.
- An adult should present at the bus stop.

Dress for Success

The Pinellas County School *Code* of *Student Conduct* includes a dress code which we must enforce.

- Shirts and blouses must have sleeves and cover the midriff.
- Shorts, skirts and dresses must be mid-thigh or longer in length.
- Pants must be an appropriate size, with the waist of the garment at the waist.
- Pants must cover undergarments —including boxer shorts.
- Clothes must be properly zipped, buttoned or otherwise fastened.
- Safe footwear must be worn. No roller skates, heelies, flip flops or bedroom slippers. Remember your children will be running around during PE.

- Have your child read to you. Third graders will be expected to score well on the reading

portion of the Florida Curriculum Assessment Test (FCAT) in order to move on to the

fourth grade. Find out now if your child is struggling.

- Check your child's assignment journal each evening to learn about the homework they have, or to read notes from their teacher.
- Come to the open house to meet the teacher. Keep in touch throughout the year.
- Join the PTA! Get to know the other families at the school. It is a great way to keep on top of what is happening.
