



I have posted the county science benchmarks for third, fourth, and fifth grades as well as the essential questions that those students should be able to answer at the end of each unit of study from November until the end of January. These concepts are covered on the FCAT test that all fifth grade students take in March. Kindergarten and primary grades are also working on lower level concepts in those same areas of study.

- Practice what you preach. The best way to influence your kids' behavior is through being a good example.


# Tech Corner ...Ms. Kip Mitchell

If your child is not currently enrolled in Pinellas County Schools and does not have a student I.D. number, follow the steps below:

- Go to a nearby school and ask to get a ParentCONNECTxp password. Bring photo I.D. with you.
- By Feb. 13, 2009, use the Student Reservation System (SRS) to get a student I.D. number. You'll need your ParentCONNECTxp password to use the SRS.
- The SRS system can be found on the community computer at the school or on the home page of the Pinellas County Schools' website, **www.pcsb.org**.
- Four-year-olds enrolled in a Pinellas County Schools' prekindergarten program already have a student I.D. number.
