Like the seasons that come and go, it is time for me to bid farewell to Bay Point. I will be retiring December 31st after thirty-six years of teaching. It has been a very rewarding career. I have made a lot of good friends and have seen many students go off to college and successful careers of their own. I have also seen great changes in education in general and in the teaching of science especially.

When I was a student here in Pinellas County, science only came in a book. When started teaching in 1973, there were books, but there were also some things called science kits stored in a locked custodial closet that no one in my school ever used. Also funding for science in schools was minimal. However, there became a greater importance at the national level for more scientists due to the advancement of the space program. More money became available for newer books, science kits, training to use those kits, funds to send teachers to state and national science conferences, and partnerships with local businesses for teachers to with to improve their science skills.

Today there is a greater demand for skilled scientists. There are now state expectations for schools and teachers to meet and for children too. However, there is less funding to support the enhancements in previous years and less time to teach science in the classroom. We are very fortunate at Bay Point to have a real science lab and a strong science program. I know that whoever is chosen to take my place will continue to support the program and be a top notched science teacher.

I would just like to like to thank all of the teachers and parents for supporting me and the science program. Many of you have contributed many hours supporting our clubs, donated science equipment, and even donated animals to the science lab. I also would like to also thank the PTA for providing funds to feed and take care of all of the animals in the lab. Most of all I would like to thank all of the current and past students for their wonderment, joy, and caring for the world around them. I will miss all of you.


Mandarin Chinese Will Again Be Offered

How to Apply for a 2010-2011 Magnet, Fundamental or Career Academy Program/School

WHAT	WHEN	HOW
Step 1: Find out about programs/schools	November 2009 through January 29, 2010	 Website, www.pcsb.org Information Fair – Saturday, Jan. 9, 10 am
Step 2: Obtain a ParentCONNECTxp User I.D. and Password IMPORTANT: If you do not already have a ParentCONNECTxp User I.D. and Password for any child in your family, go to a nearby school and ask for one. Bring photo I.D. with you.	Before applying	IMPORTANT: If you already have a ParentCONNECTxp User I. D. and Password you don't need another one. Only one User I.D. and Password is needed per family, even if you have more than one child. If you have misplaced your User I.D. and Password, visit a nearby school and bring your photo I.D.
Step 3: Apply online using your ParentCONNECTxp User I.D. and Password	Jan. 9-29, 2010	Using your home computer or the community computer at a school, log on to the Student Reservation System (SRS) on the district website, www.pcsb.org. Enter your program selections from the list of programs. The SRS will be available at additional community locations.
Step 4: Acceptance Period	March 1-8, 2010	Log on to the Student Reservation System (SRS) during this period to accept a program invitation. If this is not done, your application will not be valid.

- Jan. 9, Information Fair Northeast High School, 10 a.m.-2 p.m.

- March 1-8, Acceptance Period


