A Note From the Principal...

Greetings BPE Families and Friends,

As we approach the holiday season, it seems appropriate to consider the *art of giving*. Many educators feel that by helping others, that our children can learn responsibility, build character and citizenship, and discover the special joys of doing or giving something special. Although you will find a variety of school projects focused on helping people in our community, kids need to see that the enthusiasm for giving is also strong at home. Some brief ideas your family may consider or adapt include....

Show them YOU care. Whether you can give an hour a day or an hour a month, let your children see you volunteer your time to help those in need.

Use the news, but in moderation. Many children respond enthusiastically but very emotionally to crises like hurricanes and other disasters. They hear about them on the news and feel the need to help. Talk with your children about ways that they might be able to help—from making homemade cards to brighten a child's day to participating in a local charity fund drive.

Tap into their talents. Is your little one a chef in the making? Encourage him/her to bake a cake to take to the Nursing Home. Do you have an artist in residence? See if he/she would like to deliver his/her paintings to a nursing home to brighten the walls for those who don't get out much anymore. And, anyone can pick-up litter, give love to pets in the shelter, or read to children who just need some extra attention.

Cast-offs can be a first step. As your children outgrow toys, games and clothes, make a big deal of how you are going to pass them on to others who need them--this can be fun and very rewarding.

Finding ways for your children to focus on the needs of others is a way to help them learn how to make the world a better place.



District Application Programs

With the District Application Period beginning soon there are a few things families of 5th graders going to middle school and of incoming kindergarten students will need to do to be prepared:

Learn about the schools that interest you

- Attend Discovery Night
- Take a tour

<u>Get a parent portal ID</u>. You should have one if your child has been enrolled in a Pinellas County school, if not, bring a driver's license to any school and request one.

A word about <u>SIBLING PRIORITY</u>: you must apply online, make BPE your first choice, check the sibling priority option, and go back in to accept in February. Sibling priority is valid *only during the initial application period*.


