New Directions in Science

Please welcome our new Science Specialist, **Ms. Jodi Warson**. Ms. Warson joined us five years ago as a fifth grade teacher. She will provide program support to the classroom teachers, as well as conducting lessons in the lab.

Ms. Warson has exhibited an enthusiasm for science in her tenure at BPE. Heading up the Earth Force Club, she has built the gardens in the center of the school and works with other teachers in recycling efforts.

She was one of six teachers across the nation to swim with sharks and rays as part of an Earthwatch Institute fellowship aimed at bringing environmental science back into the classroom. The \$2,500 grant she was awarded was sponsored by the Tampa Bay Rays major league baseball organization. Ms. Warson spent 10 days with the California-based Pelagic Shark Research Foundation studying populations and natural history of several species of sharks and rays inhabiting marine estuaries and tidal flats of the Elkhorn Slough and the migratory shark species in the open waters of the Monterey Bay marine canyon.

Counseling Corner

Parents - tests are a part of school life for your student so how can you help your child prepare? Successful test-takers tend to be students with good attendance, homework, and study habits; therefore, your daily assistance with homework and attitude toward school have the biggest impact on your child's performance. However, there are key ways you can develop his test-taking ability.

- Optimize brain power by making sure your child gets enough sleep and has a good breakfast on the day of a test.
- Encourage good study habits and challenge critical-thinking skills. Reviewing test-taking strategies is important, but monitoring overall academic progress and staying in good communication with teacher will help you ward off potential problems. Good reading skills factor heavily in a timed test, so encourage reading (consider magazines, newspapers, or even comic books if he shies away from books) as much as possible. Testing also measures critical thinking ability, so ask him to discuss ideas or voice his opinion often to stimulate processes. these thought
- Know what to expect. Most teachers will send home information about the test schedule and class preparation plans well before the test. If you aren't sure what to expect, please ask your child's teacher to clarify.




