The Homework Helpline offers free homework help for students in grades 1 through 12. The Helpline is staffed by Pinellas County Schools teachers who are certified in math, science, language arts and social studies. Helpline teachers have access to textbooks commonly used in the district and can assist students with homework in most subjects. Homework help is available from 5 to 8 p.m., Monday through Thursday, on all school days, except when there is no school the following day.

Fifth graders and incoming kindergarten students who have applied for magnet school programs need to be aware of these dates:

February:

13th—20th APPLICATION ACCEPTANCE PERIOD You **must log back in** to accept an invitation. If you do not, you will lose your spot in the school.

March:

4th LATE APPLICATION / WAIT LIST

Once schools know how many families have accepted their invitation, those on the wait list will be called if space is available. Families who submitted applications during the initial period but who were not invited, will automatically be added to the wait list. Others may complete a late application on-line, and they will be ranked below those who applied during the January application period.


Young Astronaut Adventure
