Science Voyager contains 190 practice questions, along with vocabulary exercises and 8 lessons on each of the areas tested in the Sunshine State Standards. Best of all, FCAT Explorer is online, which means you can use it on any computer connected to the Internet: at school, at the library, even at home. Your performance on the FCAT can benefit from the extra time you spend studying math, reading, and science on FCAT Explorer. In January, Bay Point students will celebrate El Día de los Reyes Magos (The Three Wise Men). This is a cultural experience where students will learn how Hispanic families celebrate this important Holiday. Mexican children leave their shoes beneath the window the night of January 5th. The next morning, January 6th, they get presents and candies in their shoes. Among many other Hispanic countries, in Puerto Rico, Cuba and Spain, the children collect grass (hay) for the camels to eat and put it under their beds or by the doors so Los Reyes Magos will stop to leave presents.

Bay Point students will leave their shoes in front of Café Olé. Inside the classroom they will play a game reviewing Spanish vocabulary. When it is time to wear their shoes they will find candies inside their shoes.

  <u>NOT</u> need to do anything if you plan on staying at Bay Point Elementary Magnet School.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Students, Incoming Kindergarten students, and siblings currently not attending Bay Point Elementary Magnet School need to apply following this process:

If you plan to attend Bay Point Middle CAST Program, apply to another magnet or fundamental school, have an incoming Kindergarten student or sibling not currently attending Bay Point Elementary Magnet School, you will need to register during the application period starting on January 9 through the 29. This is done **online** and you must have registered for ParentCONNECT prior to doing this (see below). You can obtain a ParentCONNECT user ID and password at this time.

Incoming Siblings must apply and return this form:

Siblings are given priority, providing there is an opening at the grade level needed. If your child has any brothers or sisters that will be entering Bay Point for the 2010/11 school year please fill out the section below.
