

### Tech Talk

Exciting news!!!! We have been granted a trial usage (until March 31<sup>st</sup>) of a reading software program called Lexia Reading. This program has been recognized by *District Administration* Readers' Choice Top 100 K12 Products (2010 & 2008), Scholastic Administrator Best in Tech (2010 & 2009), *EdNet* Impact Award Winner (2009), and more.

Lexia Reading is a powerful technology solution that brings together Lexia's reading products: Early Reading and Primary Reading Strategies as well as Strategies for Older Students which are on student workstations and a browser-based view for teachers and administrators to see our Lexia Reading data. Each student works at their own pace and their progress is monitored daily. There is instructional content in the form of Lexia Lessons to enhance the teacher's ability to use Lexia Reading as a component of a Response to Intervention (RtI). We will be using this program with all our students in Kindergarten through fourth grade and a selection of fifth graders for a minimum of three times a week with a minimum duration of 15 minutes each time. Teachers can extend reading skills practice by printing out Lexia Skill Builders for their students to use during center time or as homework.

The next morning, January 6<sup>th</sup>, they get presents and candies in their shoes.

Among many other Hispanic countries, in Puerto Rico, Cuba and Spain, the children collect grass (hay) for the camels to eat and put it under their beds or by the doors so Los Reyes Magos will stop to leave presents.

Bay Point Elementary Magnet School is proud to nominate our partner, the U.S. Geological Survey: St. Petersburg Coastal and Marine Science Center as our Business Partner of the Year.

We have been associated with the organization for over seven years. The partnership began as part of the Mayors Mentors and More initiative and has thrived over time.

Every year the USGS has sent speakers to spend the day at our Great American Teach-In, or to work with classroom teachers to highlight various topics. Our students have learned about diatoms, watched a volcano erupt, and witnessed live action beach erosion using one of the many learning models they have provided. Our science lab has received rock collections and many other resources.



Several members of the USGS spent the

day assisting us with judging our annual school science fair. The unique background of the scientists add depth to the discussion with students as they learn to present their project.

This year the USGS helped us out by buying new parts for our onsite pond. It once again boasts crystal clear water and a fish community thanks to their contribution.
