

In the Science Lab

This month in the lab:

- The fifth grade is learning about physical and chemical reactions. They have observed whether an alka-seltzer tablet dissolves faster in hot or cold water.
- Fourth grade students are massing matter with a triple beam balance and learning that mass and weight are different.
- Magnets are mesmerizing to third graders. They have explored their properties and learned about Maglev trains.
- What's the quickest way to melt an ice cube in a plastic bag? Ask a second grader who is studying states of matter in the science lab.
- Testing which types of matter float is the topic of the week for first grade. Kindergarteners are learning about non-standard measurement. They have measured with steps and hands and other objects in the lab.

Gentle Reminders

EXCUSED ABSENCES

Please refer to your copy of the Code of Student Conduct 5500.05 (V):

- A. The student is ill or injured.
- B. There is a major illness in the student's immediate family (this means parents, brothers, sisters, grandparents, or others living in the home).
- C. There is a death in the immediate family.
- D. The student attends instruction or there is a religious holiday in the student's own faith.
- E. The student is required by summons to appear in court.
- F. Special event (see the Code for examples).
- G. The student has a scheduled medical or dental appointment.
- H. Students having a communicable disease or infestation which can be transmitted (see the Code).

The District expects parents to notify the school of their child's absence prior to the end of the school day of the absence.

During this time, parents must log in to make a decision to remain on a waiting list or to accept an invitation. Any invitation that is not accepted expires midnight on Feb. 13.

Be sure to utilize the following programs not only at school, but at home, the library, and just about anywhere you can access the internet!!!



Ticket to Read® is an online program that strengthens reading skills and knowledge with stories from social studies and science content areas.

How Do I access and use Ticket to Read?

Go to http://portal.pcsb.org. Enter your child's PCS Portal (R2.D2) Username and Password. Click Login.

On the right side of the next screen, select Ticket to Read under Student Programs.

- Kindergarten students will begin in the Phonics section.
- 1st grade students will take the initial test to determine in which section they begin.
- 2nd 5th grade students will begin in the Reading section.



ThinkCentral is a Houghton Mifflin Harcourt website that provides access to digital materials associated with Houghton Mifflin Harcourt products such as our Go Math!, Science Fusion, and Journeys textbooks.

How Do I access and use ThinkCentral?

When you log on to ThinkCentral, you will choose the selections below from the drop-down menus:

State: Florida

District: Pinellas Co School District, Largo 33770

School: Your student's school name

User name: Please use your Pinellas County Schools student user name.

However, put 52 in front of it and DO NOT include the dot

Example User name: 52r2d2

Password: The password is your Pinellas County Schools student password

Example Password: s.xxxxxxxx

Once you have filled in this information, you will click on the Log In button



FCATEXPLORER FCAT Explorer is a free, online educational program for students in grades 3-5 that reinforces reading and math skills outlined in the Sunshine State Standards. It

is provided by the Florida Department of Education.

How Do I access and use FCAT Explorer?

Go to http://fcatexplorer.com

Enter your Pinellas County Schools student user name and password in the top right-hand side of the site but omit the **s.** in your password.

Example Sign-in Name: r2.d2

Password: xxxxxxxx (Do Not include the s. before the password numbers!!!!)
