

# Young Astronauts Club Visited Kennedy Space Center

Great news: The Young Astronauts Club Group 3 has returned from another awesome adventure to Kennedy Space Center! This annual trip to KSC for *Overnight Adventure* went off without a hitch. Our group had some pretty great experiences that will stay with them a lifetime.

We all met Saturday, Feb. 12 at BPE, loaded up cars, and hit the road for Adventure! After a quick stop and late lunch at the I-4 rest area, we finished our trip to the Space Center. On arrival we met our event leaders and passed through security. We then took a tour through the rocket garden and learned about many of the history making space craft that propelled mankind to the stars. We visited the museum that housed actual capsules and spacesuits of historical missions. We completed a scavenger hunt, and one of our members won by finding all the answers.

Next we had a group activity, building a rocket from paper that was flown from a launch pad powered by compressed air. Students learned about Newton's law from this lesson. After a great dinner, we met our Astronaut, Captain Winston Scott. He is a retired Navy Flier, continued his education and became an Astronaut. Capt. Scott flew on the Space Shuttle twice, filling our heads with great stories of adventure and learning.

After a while we loaded our buses to make the trip to the Saturn V Center. There we learned about this giant rocket that took American Astronauts to the moon. We had our area to sleep under. The looks on the student's faces as they viewed this huge machine was priceless! A midnight snack, then off to sleep! 6:30 had the young explorers up and ready to eat! After a final visit to the lunar theater for a great story about Apollo 11's almost tragic moon landing we boarded our bus for a dawn behind the scene tour of KSC.

Shuttle Discovery was on the launch pad. We got to ride almost up to it which afforded us a great view of the external fuel tank and SRB's. After returning to the visitors center students loaded their belongings in the cars, and back into the Space Center we went. The rest of the day was spent seeing as much of KSC as we could. IMAX movies, hands on activities. A great event that will not be forgotten.
