### **BPE Computer Lab**

Did you know that standardized assessment test will soon all be on the computer? Here is how we are preparing our students for the future:

First and second graders have learned how to copy and paste as well as how to cut and paste in a word document.

First graders have been applying skills taught in writing and reading in the computer lab by transferring those skills in creating word documents. They've learned how to capitalize the first letter in a sentence, how to add a space between words, how to add a question mark at the end of an asking sentence, how to add an apostrophe for a contraction, as well as insert a clip art picture that goes with the sentences.

Second graders have also been applying skills taught in reading, writing, and science in the computer lab by transferring these skills in creating word documents. They've learned how to capitalize the first letter in a sentence, how to add a space between words, how to add a colon, how to insert a clip art picture that goes with the document as well as resizing the picture to fit, how to save their document to their home folder which is located on the district's server as well as retrieve their document to continue working on it.

3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, and 5<sup>th</sup> graders have been working on FCAT 2.0 Math quizzes that I've retrieved from one of the Department of Education sites and created the quizzes in the Portal Online Course in preparation for April's FCAT.
