During the month of May all classes are hard at work on their class science projects and 3rd, 4th, and 5th grades on their individual

projects for the science fair. In the science lab, Kindergarten will do some simple experiments with gliders. First graders will experiment with ways of producing sound. Second grades will do some experiments with chemical energy or magnets. Third, fourth, and fifth grades receive practice activities to help them with their science projects.

IT'S MAY LET'S GET OUT AND PLAY

As you're thinking about your child's fitness and play, it's important to keep in mind your child's age and developmental level, natural abilities, and interests. Through physical activities, kids can learn about setting goals, meeting challenges, sportsmanship, teamwork, and the value of practice.

Between the ages of 6 and 8, kids are sharpening their basic physical skills like jumping, throwing, kicking, and catching. Some kids enjoy doing this in organized sports teams, but noncompetitive leagues are the best choice for younger kids. Coaching your child's team or cheering from the stands on game days are ways you can show your support.

Kids who are 9 to 12 years old are refining, improving, and coordinating their skills. It's a time when a child's commitment to a sport may be reaffirmed, while other kids may drop out as competition heats up and level of play improves. It's okay if your child is not interested in traditional sports, but it's important to find alternative ways to be active.

If your child doesn't like soccer, basketball, or other team sports, explore other options and encourage your child to be creative. There are plenty of fun and challenging activities that your child might like more: karate, fencing, golf, bicycling, skateboarding, and tennis to name just a few.
