

Daily Attendance Ensures Success

A study from the *Journal of Educational Research* found that attendance makes a **BIG** difference in grades. Kids who are in school every day do better than those who aren't. Here are some tips to help you get your child out the door on time every morning.

Start the night before. Is the homework in the backpack? Are permission slips signed? Does he have lunch money?

Put the backpack by the door the child will go out.

Lay out clothes – down to the socks. This one step will avoid more morning fights than anything else you do.

Create a to-do list of jobs that have to be done in the morning.

- 4. Try to name the food at the grocery store.
- 5. Go to the zoo and name the animals.

- 7. Have your child teach you some songs or vocabulary words.
- 8. Ask your local librarian to locate some beginner Spanish books.
- 9. Call a friend for school and try to see how much Spanish you remember.
- 10. For the computer, get a software like Jumpstart Spanish or go to a children websites like:

No Child Left Behind and English as a Second Language (ESOL) Our outstanding teachers are dedicated to our students and to the goal of having them reach their highest level of academic achievement. Our teachers are all certified by the state of Florida and are qualified to teach the core academic subjects they are assigned. In addition, they attend professional development designed to keep them current with the best strategies to help our students achieve.

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Highly Qualified Requirements have changed. In order to be considered in compliance, the teacher must now take a Subject Area Exam in the core academic area or document core academic competency. Until this is completed, the teacher has not met the compliance standards of the NCLB Act. Mrs. Sandra Damm, 2nd grade, is in the process of meeting the compliance standards for NCLB.

In addition, some of our teachers are in the process of obtaining their English as a Second Language (ESOL) endorsement. This endorsement is designed to give teachers special strategies for working with students whose primary language is not English. This endorsement requires up to 300 hours of additional professional development. Our Science Specialist, Ms. Jodi Warson is considered out of field for ESOL while working towards this endorsement.

I am confident that these teachers will provide effective instruction in a safe learning environment to all of their students. Our teachers and staff work diligently to meet the needs of every student in our school. Your continued support of your child's education is appreciated.
