ACADEMIC TIPS: We are asking that parents continue to support and encourage **Critical Thinking**, an important skill that can help your child do well in every school subject: thinking! Consider these ideas for helping them think critically: spot similarities and differences between objects, be strategic and share your thought process (perhaps through games such as chess or checkers), and flip fairytales by encouraging your child to write a tale from another character's point of view (*modified from Home & Schools Connection*).

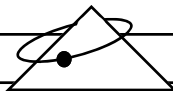
We raised a total of **\$2,505.73** for the **Leukemia and Lymphoma Society**!!!! AMAZING!!!! **\$177.00** more than last year!!
