¡Saludos! From September 15th to October 15th, people all over the United States are celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month. Data from the U.S. Census Bureau shows that more than 41 million people are of Hispanic Origin. Many Hispanic have made big contribution to this country throughout the years. Some of the great Hispanic people we honor during this month are: Pablo Casals (Spanish Catalan cellist), Salvador Dalí (surrealist artist), Ellen Ochoa (astronaut and engineer), and Roberto Clemente (first Latino in the Baseball Hall of Fame).

Learning about Hispanic heritage will help our children understand the ethnic diversity that is our country, which will lead them to understand and respect their own heritage!

Celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month by having a Spanish movie night at

home (most of our children **DVDs** have a Spanish version on it), or go to the library and get a book in 1 teaspoon of salt Spanish. Find Hispanic recipe like from Cuba, churros chocolate caliente or tortilla de patatas from Spain, and celebrate a Fiesta night, or cook a con pollo (chicken and rice) and enjoy some Latin music with your kids.

### Chicken and Rice

2 ½ pounds ready to cook chicken, cut up

½ teaspoon ground orégano

2 chopped cloves garlic

2 tablespoon of sofrito (chopped onions, green bell pepper, cilantro, red bell pepper)

cheese empanadas | 3 tablespoon of vegetable or canola oil

1/4 cup of green olives

1 tablespoon capers

2 cups of rice (medium grain)

1 ½ cup of water

1 can French onion with beef broth soup

Mix salt, orégano and garlic, and rub it on chicken. Sauté sofrito in oil. Add chicken and simmer for 15 minutes. Puerto Rican arroz Add rice, olives and capers, mix well. Turn to medium high. Add liquids, stir and cook until the water has been absorbed. Turn to low and cover until the rice is done. Approx. 20 minutes. Serve hot and enjoy!

#### Not Highly Qualified/Out of Field ~ 9-20-10

Our outstanding teachers are dedicated to our students and to the goal of having them reach their highest level of academic achievement. Our teachers are all certified by the state of Florida and are qualified to teach the core academic subjects they are assigned. In addition, they attend professional development designed to keep them current with the best strategies to help our students achieve

The No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Highly Qualified Requirements have changed. In order to be considered in compliance, the teacher must now take a Subject Area Exam in the core academic area or document core academic competency. Until this is completed, the teacher has not met the compliance standards of the NCLB Act. At this time, Joan Carfora does not have her gifted certification and is out of field for gifted.

In addition, many of our teachers are in the process of obtaining their English as a Second Language (ESOL) endorsement. At this time Kim Morgan does not have her ESOL certification and is out of field for ESOL.

This endorsement is designed to give teachers special strategies for working with students whose primary language is not English. This endorsement requires up to 300 hours of additional professional development. I am confident that she will provide excellent instruction in a safe learning environment to all of her students.
