Book Fairs and Battles

Welcome back to another exciting year at Bay Point Elementary. We will start the year off in the Media Center with library orientation for all students. During orientation students learn the library rules and care of library books. Please be aware that if your child brings home a library book they are responsible for returning the book in the same condition as it was checked out. Lost books will need to be replaced and the student will be charged for the book.

Kindergarten and first grades are allowed to bring home 1 book at a time. Second through fifth are allowed to bring home 2 books at a time. Students may keep the books for up to two weeks.

We are kicking off the year by introducing grades 3, 4 and 5 to the Sunshine State Reader Award books. These books are chosen each year by a panel of judges that include media specialists, teachers and students. They are the 15 books used in our school and county Battle of the Books.

The purpose of the Battle of the Books program is to:

- 1. Expose children to a variety of literature.
- 2. Increase students' familiarity with authors.
- 3. Encourage recreational reading.
- 4. Improve reading comprehension,
- 5. Share books through written and oral expression.

If your child would like to be a part of their classes' Battle of the Books team they should start reading as many of these books as possible now. They are available in our library, the public library and at all bookstores. Look for the Battle of the Books display.

The Scholastic Book fair is coming to Bay Point Sept. 22nd-26th. Each class has an assigned buying time to visit the fair. Look for the book fair flyer coming home soon that will have information on your child's buying day and how to shop at the fair. Some of the important things to remember are:

If you send cash please put it in an envelope with your child's name on it. Students can purchase gift certificates in any amount for classroom teachers.

Parents were given a password and user ID. The user ID begins with "p." and is followed by your name. The password is generated by the district, and is case sensitive. Please keep it in a safe place so that you are able to access your child's information.

Volunteers Reactivate For This Year

Volunteers must reactivate in the computer. Usually the user ID is "v." followed by your last name, first initial (e.g. v.smithp). Your password is your last name (capitalize the first letter) followed by your four digit year of birth (e.g. Smith2012). Once you have reactivated you will not have to fill out paperwork again for this school year.


Young Astronauts
