English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) is designed to meet the needs of students with limited English proficiency. These students may have difficulty understanding, speaking, reading, and writing the English language without additional support.

ESOL Goals:

- To help students attain English language arts and reading proficiency, so they can succeed in all of their classes.
- To provide instruction that satisfies cultural as well as language needs.
- To promote an appreciation of different cultures and their contributions to our society.

English Language Learners (ELLs) receive language arts and reading instruction from certified teachers using effective teaching methods. In schools with significant numbers of students with limited English proficiency, bilingual assistants provide additional support in academic subject area classes and also help with home-school communications.
