3 Credits Social Studies


1 Credit Fine and Performing Arts, Speech and Debate, or Practical Arts

8 Elective Credits

# What will happen if my child does not pass one of the graduation assessment?



- 1. If he/she does not pass the FSA:
- Retake FSA, or take ACT, SAT
- 2. If he/she does not pass the EOC Algebra 1:
- Retake EOC Algebra 1 or take: PERT (Postsecondary Education Readiness Test)




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

### What is the parent Roadmaps for?

The parent Roadmaps in English language arts/literacy and in mathematic provide guidance to parents about what their children will be learning and how they can support that learning in high school. The parent roadmaps provide three-year snapshots showing how selected standards progress from year to year so that students will be college and career ready upon their graduation from high school.





## How can I help my child become successful at school?

- Make sure your child is at school every day and is ready to learn
- Be an active part of your child's school life- know what classes she/he has, assessments she/he is required to take, and testing calendar
- Know the graduation requirements
- Communicate with your child's teacher/grade level guidance counselor to find out ways you can help
- Check FOCUS weekly
