II. Group News

Caroline Brown, High Point Neighborhood Family Center -Program Director, introduced Cencio Minson, new full time staff member who will be assisting the Hispanic families going to the center. Caroline shared information about the Build Bee Hive, a free event organized for families and the community at HPNFC on Sat, Sept 15.

Ed Tumber, Branch Manager Clearwater Public Library System introduced Daise Castillo, new Hispanic Outreach Coordinator for Clearwater Public Library System.

Doug Haskitt, Director of Pinellas Refugee Education Program (PREP) talked about the Refugee Day Celebration event coming on June 2019, and he invited all the community partners to join to the event.

III. Presentation(s):

Ericka Reckenwald shared the ESOL Family Outreach Outcomes from 2017-2018 School Year. She explained that the support provided to PCS ESOL families and students increased significantly in comparison with the previous year. More ESOL families and students participated in ESOL educational workshops, community resource fairs, and college/ career events for EL students in high school. Ericka also shared the ESOL Family Outreach 2018-2019 Action Plan, and showed the schedule of the workshops for EL families.

Jennifer Weaver Pinellas Technical College Occupational Specialist expressed that PTC is open to partner with the community to support events that benefit PCS students and their families. She expressed that PTC can provide the venue to invite people in the county to provide information about the first-rate career and technical education programs at PTC. Jennifer talked about the Pinellas Technical College Signing Day event on February 2019, a great event for students in Pinellas County. She offered the PTC facility to hold any ESOL community event for ESOL families and students.

Yaridis L. Garcia, Juvenile Welfare Board Community Planning Manager, shared the High Point Community Bus Ride project, an event coordinated to connect High Point families with resources available in the community. Yaridis shared the flyer of the event and asked for venders.

IV. ESOL Community Resource Fair/Event Plan Discussion

Ericka thanked all the community partners for their partnership and participation in the ESOL Community Resource Fairs every year, and for supporting the ESOL families and students with available community resources and social services in Pinellas County.

Ericka gave special thanks to the High Point Neighborhood Family Center, St. Petersburg College, the Hispanic Outreach Center, Largo Public Library, and Clearwater East Library for partnership with the ESOL Family Outreach and hosting events for PCS ESOL families and students.

Ericka talked about the planning of the ESOL Community Resource Fair 2018-2019 school year. She asked for ideas on how to improve the event for the ESOL families, and asked for a good location for the resource fair in mid-county.

Joe Benavides -SPC Clearwater Campus and Jennifer Weaver -Pinellas Technical College offered their campus facility to hold the ESOL Community Resource fair.

The community partners shared ideas and proposed the formation of a committee to discuss details about the planning of the ESOL fair.

The formation of a committee was agreed. The community partners interested in being member of the committee signed a list provided by Ramona Zambrano, PCS ESOL Bilingual Specialist. Ramona will follow up with the committee to go over the details for the fair.
