Dual Enrollment @

High school students attending Pinellas Technical College (PTC) have the opportunity to be dual enrolled in post-secondary courses tuition free! These courses give students credits towards a high school diploma and a career technical certificate. Hours completed at PTC may also transfer as credit hours to local and state colleges. Students who are registered for dual enrollment courses will have three grades per semester recorded on their high school transcript. Therefore, students need to be very dedicated to their best performance in PTC coursework because the resulting grades can greatly impact postsecondary education opportunities and scholarship opportunities.

In order to take Dual Enrollment classes at PTC during the fall and spring semester, students must:

•Be at least 16 years old and entering their junior or senior year in high school

•Have a minimum cumulative unweighted GPA of 2.0, or 2.5 GPA for medical-related programs •Show responsibility through high school attendance and behavior.

•Obtain a Dual Enrollment Application from their high school counselor.

•Return completed application to their high school counselor, with all necessary signatures.

•Once the PTC counselor has received the application, the student will be contacted regarding a shadowing date.



Credit Recovery Options

- APEX This puts students in an online credit recovery course during the school day. They do not begin the year on track and lose an elective during the day.
- Summer Bridge This option allows students to make up courses quickly over the summer. They begin the next year on track and do not lose classes during the day.
