Volunteer Registration and Background

<u>Screening Procedures</u>

All new volunteer applicants must complete a volunteer registration form online at <u>asd.pcsb.org/schoolwiresforms/volunteer/</u>.

A Level 1 (National Background Screening at no cost to the volunteer) will be processed by the District Office Of Strategic Partnerships. Please confirm with the Family & Community Liaison at the school if additional Level 2 screening is a requirement for volunteering. When the applicant has been Level 1 background checked approved they will receive an email with the volunteer's user ID and password to log their volunteer hours in the volunteer system. No longer is the school logging in the hours.

Volunteers are required to sign in and show ID at the front office, and wear a volunteer name tag while on campus or at a school sponsored event. All Level 1 volunteers will be escorted to and from their volunteer destination and will be in line site of a PCSB Employee or Level 2 volunteer. All Level 2 needs to wear their level 2 issued badge on campus.

If you're a returning volunteer you to reactivate your profile on the volunteer system every year.

Did You Know!!! Page 4 **ATTENDANCE MATTERS!**

Why September Matters:

Research has shown that attendance habits established in September persist over the whole year.

Students who missed fewer than 2 days in September continued to average fewer than 2 days absent each month.

Students who missed 2 to 4 days in September were 5 times more likely than those who missed fewer than 2 days to be chronically absent for the year.

Nearly 9 out of 10 students who missed more than 4 days in September were chronically absent that year.

Chronic Absences (or missing 2 or more days of school a month, whether excused or unexcused) as early as Pre-K is associated with poor reading skills and retention in the 3rd grade. By the 6th grade, it is considered as early warning indicator that a student will drop out of high school.
