### Ways to Engage

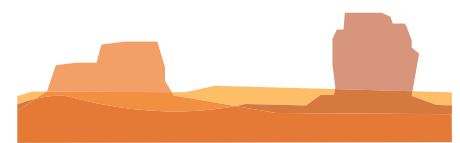
- Explore a theme through videos focusing on select works from our collection.
