Beginning in 2019-20, the AP Art and Design portfolios will each consist of two sections:

- 1. **Sustained Investigation** (60% of exam score) For all three portfolios, students will submit images and writing to document their inquiry-guided investigation through practice, experimentation, and revision:
 - 15 digital images that include works of art and design and process documentation.
 - Typed responses to prompts, providing information about the questions that guided their investigation and how they practiced, experimented, and revised, guided by their questions.
- 2. Selected Works (40% of exam score)

For all three portfolios, students will submit works of art and design and writing to demonstrate skillful synthesis of materials, processes, and ideas:

- For AP 2-D Art and Design and AP Drawing: 5 physical works or high-quality reproductions of physical works with written responses on paper describing the materials, processes, and ideas used.
- For AP 3-D Art and Design: Digital images of 5 works (2 views of each) with typed responses describing the materials, processes, and ideas used.

SKETCHBOOK (Continued)

Your Sketchbook is not and should not be limited to just finished drawing but should be more like a blueprint of your thoughts and ideas, a sketch-journal.

This might include:

• Drawings of ideas for Sculptural Compositions

In addition to a primary sketch you can include other angles of the form, notes about materials, process, notes about symbolism, meaning, style, surface treatment, application of color.

- Magazine clippings, for reference or for inspiration.
- Write Reflections about art-related experiences
- Come up with a few ideas for the Concentration/Sustained Investigation section of your portfolio. This is a Series whereby the artworks are connected to one another by theme, visually, stylistically, with the materials; or all of those things)
 Make note of things, observations, issues you find interesting, peculiar, inspiring, etc.

Write these rough drafts in your Sketchbook!

Help with Written Statement:

- What is the central idea of your work?
- How does your work demonstrate the exploration of your idea?
- Why did you choose this theme?
- What are your inspirations for creating these artworks?
- Which media, techniques, and work processes did you use, and why did you make those choices?
- What do you intend for audiences to see, experience, and think about when viewing your work?
- Did your work involve research? What kinds of investigations and discoveries were involved?
