You will write a response to <u>one</u> of the following essay prompts. Please use MLA format for in-text citations and include a works cited page at the end of the essays for the book and any sources you may have used while writing. - In a well written essay, compare and contrast the images of survival and immortality in *Scythe* with another work such as *Unwind*, *Tuck Everlasting* [film or book], or *Escape from Camp 14*. Consider the worlds these characters inhabit and why they would choose immortality or reject it. Include references to both texts with citations for direct quotes or paraphrases, 2 pages typed, in MLA format double spaced, size 12 font.
- In this argumentative essay, you introduce yourself as a Scythe and describe your code of ethics or thinking about your profession of gleaning. Using examples from the text and your code of ethics, which character would you choose to glean? Two
