## **Assignments**

Frankenstein: As you read consider Shelley's theme of mankind's thirst for scientific knowledge going too far and note where it can be found in the story. Also consider the theme of personal responsibility and note examples from the text. We will also be discussing the frame structure of the novel and how it contributes to the text. This book was written in England and published in 1818. Please look up and make notes about the state of medicine and science in general at this time. What were the beliefs? You should also look for biographical info about Mary Shelley. She is a fascinating and tragic figure in British literature.

In the Wake of the Plague: As you read make notes on how the progression of the bubonic plague changed Western European society. We are going to be looking into the history of the plague in great detail. Make sure that you understand how the plague changed educational philosophy, and society's views on religion and governments.

Please have your notebook on the first day of school, as it will be checked that day.
