Role of the Graduation Committee

- Monitor the progress (with real-time data) of students toward a successful graduation!
 - Implement immediate steps in support of schools as necessary after review of real-time data
- Continuous review of our multi-tiered system of support for graduation success
- Continuous review of national and PCS powerful practices that positively impact graduation success for students

Graduation Requirements summarized...

Students must earn either 24 credits or 18 credits ACCEL legislation- for a standard high school diploma

- ► English (4 credits) and earn a passing score on the 10th Grade FSA ELA Reading/Writing Assessment
- ► Math (4 credits) which must include algebra and geometry, and earn a passing score on the FSA Algebra 1 EOC
- Science (3 credits) which much include biology and 2 other Equally Rigorous Science Courses
- Social Studies (3 credits) which much include world history, US History, American Government and economics

Grad Requirements continued...

- ▶ A physical education credit (HOPE) (omitted if choosing the ACCEL option)
- A fine arts or practical arts credit
- And 8 additional elective credits (3 if choosing the ACCEL option)
- And... last but not least... one complete course from any of these requirements must be successfully completed by our students in an online or blended environment

How do we know that our systems are working?


- Graduation Rates are increasing for all groups
