- Access points reflect the core intent of the Standards with reduced levels of complexity.

Diploma Pathways

- Special Diploma (only available for students with significant cognitive disabilities)
 - 24 credits, 2.0 GPA
 - Only current 11th and 12th graders (2012-2013 and 2013-2014 years of entry) are still eligible for a Special Diploma (they would have been working toward a Special Diploma already)

Special Diploma

- Only current 11th and 12th graders (2012-2013 and 2013-2014 years of entry) are still eligible for a Special Diploma (they would have been working toward a special diploma already)
- Any student who enters high school in 2014-2015 or beyond will not be eligible to work toward a Special Diploma
 - Standard Diploma on Access Points
- Students already working toward a Special Diploma may continue

Diploma Pathways

- Standard Diploma on Access Points (only available for students with significant cognitive disabilities)
 - 24 credits, 2.0 GPA
 - Students in the 2014-2015 cohort and beyond
 - Graduation requirements are the same as a student working toward a Standard Diploma
- ACCEL (available to ALL students with disabilities, including those enrolled in Access courses)
 - 18 credits, 2.0 GPA

Standard Diploma on Access Points

- Only students with significant cognitive disabilities are eligible for this diploma option
- Graduation requirements are the same as any student working toward a Standard Diploma
- Recognized as the same Standard Diploma that other students receive
- Courses are labeled as <u>Access</u> courses
- 18 credit (ACCEL) option is available
