


What do we do?

Our student services team works collaboratively to best meet the needs of our students and families.

Each of us have a unique role and certain areas of expertise.









School Counselor

- <u>Individual counseling services</u> are available on an as-needed or a limited ongoing basis for students.
- <u>Small group counseling services</u> developed based on the needs of our students. These groups occur during lunch time and require parental permission.
- School-wide classroom lessons are taught to every student and focus on social-emotional learning as well as personal safety issues.

Support is offered to families and teachers in addressing the needs of their students.

ELP – Extended Learning Program

- ▶ 5th Grade Math Laura Payne (virtual), Kathy Genens (in-person), Jen Cocio (in-person); 1x/week

ELERM

Supports Struggling Students During the School Day

- Occurs both virtually and face-to-face
- ▶ Taught by Ms. Veronica Jensen and Ms. Dee McCarthy
- Tier 3 students in need of additional intervention in reading

STEM – Science, Technology, Engineering and Math

- Educational Enrichment offered by Pinellas County Schools Science Department and taught by teachers at Curlew Creek Elementary weekly beginning in December

- → 3rd Grade Ms. Michelle Brooks
- 4th Grade Ms. Dawn Avolt
- ▶ 5th Grade Ms. Dawn Avolt

Rising Kindergarten

- Grant from the State of Florida to provide instruction to students who could not complete VPK last year due to COVID-19 shutdowns
- Began in October and must end by March 31, 2021
- Small group instruction (no more than 4 students) using the Nemours Bright Start curriculum
- Taught before, during, and after school, 4 days/week, by Ms. Cassandra Thomopoulos and Ms. Dee McCarthy

RAP – Reading Acceleration Program

- Scholarship opportunity awarded to students identified as substantially reading deficient in 3rd, 4th, or 5th grade.
- Parent must complete an application that must be approved prior to beginning the program
- 12 face-to-face sessions with a certified teacher, outside of the school day
- No more than 2 students in a group, 1 is preferred
