Pinellas County Schools has partnered with Sandy Hook Promise to offer the Say Something Anonymous Reporting System. Say Something allows you to submit secure & anonymous safety concerns to help identify and intervene upon at-risk individuals. Tips are passed along to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials.

Additionally, the district utilizes FortifyFL, a school-related suspicious activity reporting tool that allows Florida students and the community the ability to instantly relay information anonymously concerning unsafe, potentially harmful, dangerous, violent or criminal activities, or the threat of these activities, to the appropriate law enforcement agencies and school officials. FortifyFL was created and funded by the 2018 Florida Legislature as part of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School Public Safety Act.

## Counselor Corner

I am so excited to be back for year #2 at San Jose!

My name is Maria Gosart, and I am your student's school counselor. I counsel from the perspective of the person – centered theory, which promotes empathetic understanding (understanding the person's point of view), being genuine to one's true self, displaying and promoting unconditional positive regard, and using a non – judgmental attitude. My counseling is brief and solution-focused. I will help students to set short-term goals, focusing on success in school.

Counseling Program Mission Statement:

The mission of the San Jose Elementary School Comprehensive School Counseling Program is to create a safe and caring environment that promotes all students to grow in their academic, career, and socialemotional development. The school counselor supports administration, teachers, support staff, as well as families and community members in preparing San Jose students to become future ready citizens that embody the character education qualities that are celebrated throughout the course of the school year.

We are happy to announce that San Jose has partnered with Feeding Tampa Bay, and they will be providing us with a free food market on campus. All San Jose families are welcome to come "shop" at the market free of charge. We will have fresh produce, meats & pantry items available.

Why "school counselor" and not "guidance counselor?"

The American School Counselor Association (ASCA) encourages the use of "school counselor" to more accurately reflect the role.

Historically, the first term was *vocational guidance*. In the 1930s guidance became a service within pupil personnel services with five services: *information, assessment, counseling, placement and follow-up*. Common labels used were *guidance* and *counseling*. Following ASCA's lead, counseling became the label of choice as in school counseling programs. Guidance is still present but is used to label one of the delivery the program, the guidance curriculum.

A *Guidance Counselor* is reactive, has some impact - measured via feelings and perceptions, an ancillary role to school improvement process, works in isolation

A *School Counselor* is proactive, data-driven, creates inclusive curriculum, has impact that is measured via achievement, uses attendance and behavior data, is an essential role in the school improvement process, a leader in development, management, and evaluation of a comprehensive school counseling program.
