COMPLETE THE SELF-SCREENING TOOL



DO NOT ENTER IF YOU HAVE:

- Tested positive for COVID-19
- A COVID-19 test that is pending
- Been told by a medical professional that you likely have COVID-19
- Someone in your household with COVID-19
- Had close contact with anyone in the past 14 days who has been diagnosed with COVID-19
- Symptoms of fever, cough and/or shortness of breath



Schoolwide:

- Increased sanitation, day & night.
- Hand sanitation stations installed throughout.
- One-way directional patterns throughout.
- Masks for all 4 yrs and up.
- Social distancing, 6' to the great extent possible.
- Minimized travel on campus.
- Bottle filling station installed, water fountains disabled.
- Additional signage.
- Visitor limitations.



All employees, essential contractors and registered visitors should wear face coverings/masks while in areas where they may have interactions with others and when social distancing is not possible.



Arrival and Dismissal

- Parents who bring their student to and from school will use the car circle for arrival and dismissal. Parents will not be permitted to park and walk students on or off campus.
- Pre-K parents will drop their student in the car circle to be escorted by a staff member.
- Families of students in Mrs. Molina, Mrs. Lumm and Mrs. Vincent's classes will receive information about arrival and dismissal processes from their teacher.
- Car riders will be staged for dismissal in the pod and on the pod playground; 6' apart to the greatest extent possible.
- Bus and van riders will be staged for dismissal under the covered area and in the picnic area; 6' apart to the greatest extent possible.
- The car circle will open at 2:30. Primary students will be released first. Primary parents should enter the car circle prior to 2:55 ahead of parents of intermediate students.
- Families of intermediate students should not enter the car circle prior to 3:00. Families with multiple aged students should use the car circle during the time of dismissal for the oldest student.
- Parents who will be picking up a child for early dismissal will be expected to call the front office when they arrive at the school and remain in their vehicle in front of the main office. A staff member will bring the child to the vehicle, check your identification, and assist you in signing out the student. There is no dismissal within 15 minutes of the regular end of the school day, and only parents, guardians, or other individuals identified on the student's contact list, with appropriate identification, will be allowed to leave with the student.
- Walkers may meet parents outside the bike compound area.



Cafeteria

- Breakfast will be "grab & go" to the classroom.
- Seating will be 6' apart to the greatest extent possible.
- One-way traffic patterns, one door to enter and to exit.
- The lunch schedule adjusted to accommodate social distancing.



Clinic

- Contact tracing and direction will be provided by the Health Department in collaboration with the Pinellas County Schools Health Services Department.
- Students will be escorted by an adult to clinic as needed.
- Symptomatic students will be held in isolation room for parent pick-up.

Classroom Modifications

- Seating for all students will be 6' apart to the greatest extent possible.
- To maximize space, non-essential furniture removed.
- Surfaces are cleared for frequent sanitizing.
- Small group instruction occurs with limited numbers.
- Student personal items will not be shared (ex; pencils, scissors, glue sticks).
- Increased hand sanitizing before and after touching common spaces or shared materials.
- Hand washing techniques will be taught, re-taught and monitored as needed.
- A personal water bottle will be provided for students.
