

"Play is the basis of all art, books, sports, movies, fashion, fun, and wonder - civilization. Play is the vital essence of life."

Are we so focused on academics that we are neglecting how the brain learns? I am glad that there are more movement breaks in the school day and recess is making somewhat of a comeback but more movement has to occur at home. Children need to get outdoors to play and to play without rules all the time. Play teaches children how to control themselves and how to interact with others. Play also develops cognitive agility.

Open ended play – the play that uses imagination, for example playing with an empty box, has decreased by 25% from 1981-1997. Pre-school children's motor ability is in direct correlation to their intellect when they enter kindergarten. A study of low-income children from preschool to age 23 showed that only 7% of those who were exposed to a play oriented pre-school were arrested on felony charges while those children who were exposed to an instruction oriented preschool experienced 33% felony arrests.

A Texas Study found that there was a direct correlation between fitness scores and test scores in science, math and language arts. The study also found that with increased fitness scores there was a decrease in discipline problems and an increase in school attendance.

Non-productive activity increases productive activity and play supports learning, the key word being activity. Decrease in movement and play increases weight retention. Increase in weight is associated with a decrease in brain volume by 4-8%.

There is also an increase in screen time for children via TV (which is more high definition,) iPad, computer and tablet. All of these emit a blue light which disrupts the brain pattern for sleep not to mention it promotes sitting and not moving. It is the opposite of being active. Children should not be screen watching at least an hour before bedtime in order to get a full nights rest. Screen time during the day should be broken up with movement opportunities.

We all need to move more and what better way than through play? In my physical therapy sessions with the special needs students, I incorporate as much play as possible because I know children learn best when playing.
