Self-Control	Situation: Sam and his brother are home alone. His parents have a strict rule about no snacks before dinner. Dilemma: On the one hand Sam can give into his temptation and raid the cookie jar. On the other hand Sam knows he should show self-control and wait until after dinner. Discussion: What advice do you have for Sam?	Situation: Sam is playing ball with his friend. The ball accidentally hits Sam hard. It hurts, begins to swell, and is turning red. Discussion: What is your advice for Sue?	Week 4 Situation: The students in Sue's class are loud and noisy. The teacher is trying to get their attention. Dilemma: On one hand Sue wants to finish her conservation with her friends. On the other hand Sue knows to show self-control she needs to stop talking. Discussion: What is your advice for Sue?
