<u>Attendees:</u> Bob Towner, Audrey Chaffin, Jenny Riddick, Jackie Bruckler, Sophia Johnson (phone), Miranda Henry (phone)

Welcome: Bob welcomed us, and the minutes were approved.

<u>SAC Meetings</u> Next Year's meetings will be scheduled on Tuesdays from 12:30 to 1:30. First meetings will be in August and September then they will be bi-monthly.

SIP Goals: Goals for next year will focus on ELA, Math, Science, and Culture and Climate (including family engagement, PBIS and attendance).

<u>Modified Dress Code Policy</u>: Teacher's would like to see only solid navy or gray jackets to keep with the uniform look. It was discussed hoods or no hoods and should there be other colors. At this time no consensus was made. We will table it and address uniform color and styles for jackets and shirts next year since there were a lot of opinions on the committee. Teachers will be asked to enforce no outerwear outside when weather is not cold.

<u>Title 1 Compact:</u> The Title 1 Compact was reviewed. In the student section we added that socks should be solid navy, white or black. In the teacher section we added that teachers need to enforce the dress code a spart of their pledge.

<u>Title 1 Plan & Budget:</u> We reviewed the CNA and the data that drove the needs. No suggestions were given but after reviewing the Title 1 Budget, it was agreed to prioritize the funding for small group instruction. Due to lack of funding, the MTSS Coach position will not be reinstated. (She will go back into the classroom.) We support using funds to hire more hourly teachers or paraprofessionals. It is our hop they will have continuous trainings to support their growth like teachers get.

<u>Superintendent Leadership Group:</u> The new superintendent wants to hear from students, so he had a youth leadership conference. (We sent two 4th and two 5th grade students.) He wanted to know what they thought needed to be improved within our schools/district. Based on their voices, a survey regarding school lunches was launched for more input. He plans to have more conferences in the future.

<u>Attendance:</u> We are looking much better with attendance. Our highest absences are in the subgroup of Hispanic and Multiracial.

<u>Behavior</u>: We now have 39 referrals. The most came from Hispanic and Multiracial.
