Safety Patrols are a select group of 5th graders who are committed to providing a safe school environment for all students at Starkey Elementary. Safety Patrol participation offers students an early opportunity to serve as a school volunteer. It is an organization that promotes:

Patrol Expectations

- 1. Be at flagpole at 8:05 AM for attendance
- 2. AM duty begins 8:15 AM; PM duty ends 3:10 PM
- 3. Be polite and courteous while on duty.
- 4. A safety belt must be worn and visible while on duty.
- 5. Positive behavior is expected in your classroom and all around campus. Any behavior problems may result in suspension or removal from patrols.
- 6. While on duty do not permit your attention to be diverted by unnecessary conversations or horseplay.
- 7. Notify Mrs. Doyle or Mrs. Marcum in advance of anticipated absence.
- 8. Maintain a conduct grade of E or V and maintain grades of at least a B or better throughout the whole year.

Safety Patrol is a big responsibility, but we want it to be a fun and rewarding experience for you. Always feel free to talk to your patrol sponsors (Mrs. Doyle/Mrs. Marcum) about any problems or concerns you have.





Post Descriptions

Car Circle:

- * Greet incoming students and parents with a smile and "Have a nice day."
- * Keep cars moving by waving them forward.
- * Stand behind yellow line within the numbered openings on guard rails.
- * Be alert and pay attention to the traffic. "Face" the direction cars are coming.
- * When students get out of car, walk behind guiding them to sidewalk area.
- * Never step out into car circle until the wheels have come to a complete stop. If something has fallen or rolled out, call an adult to retrieve.
- * Do not lean on building or guard rails.
- * Do not visit with friends while on car duty.
- * Get approval from the adult on duty to be dismissed at the end of duty.

Bus Circle:

- * Monitor student safety while entering or exiting the bus.
- * Greet in coming student.
- * Be alert and pay attention to the traffic.
- * Instruct students to go directly through gate after getting off bus.
- * Monitor students as they wait to be loaded onto the bus.
- * Remind students to walk and to stay on sidewalks.

Outside Hallways:

- * Stand by the doors and greet students and staff.
- * Open doors for teachers and students.
- * Monitor students as they enter their building.
- * Remind students to walk and to stay on sidewalks at all times.

Flag Pole:

- * Always work with a partner. It's a 2 person job.
- * Get the flags from the front office.
- * Treat the flag respectfully and never let it touch the ground.
- * If you've been instructed to fly the flag at Half-Staff, make sure you take them all the way to the top of the flag pole before bringing it half-way down the flag pole.
- * If it's raining, the flag will not be put up.
- * Always fold the flag according to official flag folding rules.
- * If the flag is wet, ask someone in the office where you should hang it to dry (NEVER fold it up when it is even a little bit wet.)





Post Descriptions Continued

Cafeteria Helpers:

- * Help students opening containers.
- * Provide utensils if student forgot.
- * Assist adults as needed.

Bike Rack:

- * Greet students with "Good morning" or "Have a nice day".
- * Remind bikers they must walk beside their bikes once on campus.

Kindergarten and Pre-K:

- * Assist teachers as needed in the morning with Pre-K students.
- * Walk students to bus or car circle in afternoon.

Weather:

- * In light rain students are provided raincoats to wear while on duty.
- * During heavy thunderstorms or lightning students will not be allowed to go to their post.



Starkey Elementary Safety Patrol Contract



Choosing to be a school safety patrol is a huge responsibility. You are a role model for the students at Starkey. Patrols are expected to exemplify the characteristics of leadership and citizenship in all aspects of their day.

Report to duty on time:

- * Morning patrols are expected to report to duty at 8:05 AM at the Starkey flag pole.
- * Afternoon patrols are to report directly to their post and will be dismissed at 3:10 PM.
 - * A safety patrol belt must be worn and visible while on duty.
- * Attendance will be taken daily (both AM & PM). Patrols late to their duty 3 times in one semester will receive a warning.
 - 3 unexcused absences in a semester can result in removal from safety patrol duties. Three warnings can result in removal from safety patrol duties. *

Perform my duties faithfully:

- * Perform duties as outlined in Starkey Patrol Program booklet.
 - * Be polite and courteous while on duty.
- * When your patrol belt is on, you are a role model for other Starkey students. Behavior unbecoming of a patrol can result in removal from being a safety patrol.

Follow school and classroom expectations:

- * Maintain a conduct grade of E or V.
- * Maintain grades of at least a "B" or better throughout the whole year.
 - *Any behavior problem will result to the following actions:

1st offense: verbal warning.

2nd offense: written warning and/or change of posts. 3rd offense: suspension from duties.

4th offense: removal from duties.
