Belle of the Ball Project is a 501(C) 3 non-profit organization which provides homecoming and prom dresses to in need, low income, high school girls in Pinellas, Hillsborough, and surrounding counties. Our mission statement: "No girl should be denied the opportunity to attend her high school dance because of financial difficulties"

We are a 100% volunteer organization and rely on donations and

volunteers. We distribute dresses twice yearly in the fall for homecoming and again in the spring for prom.

Girls qualify for a dress if they appear in person and attest that they are currently having financial difficulties. They also qualify if they have been referred by a school Social Worker, Guidance Counselor, Principal, Community Involvement Personnel, Guardian ad Litem, Foster Care or other non-profit organization or agency. No referral letter is needed.

Our boutique location is: 1210 Holt Ave. Clearwater, FL 33755. Our boutique is ONLY open on designated shopping days. We are not open year-round.

Prom shopping dates: Saturdays, March 25 and April 8, 10am-2pm These are the ONLY days to receive a dress. No appointments are necessary; no do they make them.
