Our general meeting, on November 7, included some great discussion that will guide the future plans for our PTA. Parents, teachers, and students all gave their input on what advocacy efforts they would like to be a part of, as well as information they would like to have presented, relating to the health, safety, and educational well-being of all children. This interactive part of our meeting began with a "State of the School" address by Principal Finkbiner, followed by group discussion facilitated by National PTA, Director of Education and Leadership Development, Mary Pat King.

The best part of the meeting was when we proudly recognized all the students that chose to enter into our Reflections program! We had seven entries all in the Special Artist Division! Students of all grades and abilities are able to participate in this nationally acclaimed program. Students may choose to enter in one or all of the available arts categories: Dance Choreography, Music Composition, Film Production, Photography, Literature, and Visual Arts. They create their work of art based on a chosen theme. This year's theme is "What Is Your Story?"

All work was judged by experienced arts and education volunteers based on the following criteria: Interpretation of the Theme, Creativity, and Mastery of Skills. All students received a certificate, ribbon, and "Members for a Day" passes from the Florida Museum of Photographic Arts; which allows two guests free entry into the museum.

## McKinney-Vento Act Definitions

Individuals who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime residence Share the housing of others due to financial hardship (this is called "doubled-up" Live in motels, hotels, trailer parks, camping grounds substandard housing due to lack of adequate alternative accommodations Living in emergency or transitional shelters Living in a public or private place not designed for humans to live

Living in cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus or train stations, etc.

Migratory children living in above circumstances





## McKinney-Vento Rights and Services

Removal of all barriers to a free, appropriate public education Education in a mainstream school environment Free meals at school, Transportation to school of origin, School supplies No isolation or stigmatization due to their homeless status Placement in their school of origin the entire time they are homeless, and until the end of any academic year in which they move into permanent housing Consideration of parent's requests regarding placement at the school of origin or the zoned school

Educational, social, athletic, and recreational services offered to other students Prompt resolution of disputes regarding educational placement

### **Trauma Informed Care**

Exports explain that trauma is not an event itself, but rather a response to a stressful experience in which a person's ability to cope is dramatically undermined.

Homelessness is a traumatic experience. Individuals and families experiencing homelessness are under constant stress, unsure of whether they will be able to sleep in a safe environment or obtain a decent meal. They often lack a stable home and also the financial resources. Use skills, and social supports to change their circumstances (Shelter from the Storm: TIC in homeless services settings).

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## PTA Resources for Families: Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) was first passed in 1965 by President Lyndon Baines Johnson. In December 2015, the U.S. Congress passed the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), a new law to replace the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB). President Obama subsequently signed ESSA into law on December 10, 2015. With a new ESEA/ESSA, focus for advocacy now turns to effective implementation of the law to ensure every child has the ability to reach their full potential. The U.S. Department of Education is currently in the implementation phase of ESSA.

National PTA, and advocates across the country are seeking to empower all families to be active participants in the state and local implementation of ESSA to ensure equity and opportunity for all students. Visit <u>www.pta.org/essa</u> for more information on how you can get involved.
