More, Less or Equal

Gather 10 small items from around the house (e.g., coins, small toys, etc.). Divide the objects between each person. Ask the child to count each person's objects and determine who has more, who has less or are they equal amounts. Repeat using different combinations and amounts.

Soapy Water Play

Fill a bucket or large bowl with water and a little soap to make it sudsy. Gather small items from around the house that can get wet (toys, plastic baby dolls, cars, plastic plates, cups, etc.) and have a sudsy wash



Let's Count

Go on a hunt around your house or outside and collect 5 of the same/similar items to count. (e.g., coins, toys, sticks, leaves, etc.). Can you find 3 more? How many do you have now?





Paper Plate Fish

Using a paper plate, crayons, markers, or whatever you have around the house. Make a paper plate fish and decorate it. If you don't have a paper plate you can use plain paper.

Name Game

Gather items around your house that begin with all the letters in your name. If you don't have an item for every letter, you can draw a picture.

(e.g., My name is Sam)



Story Time Illustrator

Together make up a story. It could be about things that live in the sea. Using plain paper, crayons or markers encourage children to create the illustrations for the story.



Drive in Movie

Line towels in rows on the floor as cars in front of the TV. Turn the lights down and show a movie. Make and sell homemade tickets and refreshments (real or pretend).
