



Pinellas County Student Film Festival (PCSFF)

Rules and Regulations

General Rules

- Every entry must include credits in the video.
- Videos must follow the annual theme unless otherwise noted.
- All participants must be students affiliated with Pinellas County Schools and have a media release on file.
- File size limit: 1GB. Preferred format: MP4 (H.264).
- Categories marked with an asterisk (*) allow submissions in both that category and one additional category.

Categories

- Animation: 2D/3D animation using clay, objects, or models. (5-minute limit)
- Book Trailers: Video advertisement for a book (not required to align with the theme). (2-minute limit)
- Comedy: Humorous story with comedic elements. (5-minute limit)
- *Digital Responsibility: A film focused on the topic of Digital Responsibility (5-minute limit)
- Documentary: Real facts and events. (5-minute limit)
- Drama: Emotional and creative storytelling. (5-minute limit)
- Instructional Video: Educational content. (5-minute limit)
- Music Video: Visuals set to music. Must follow copyright law. (5-minute limit)
- PSA: Public Service Announcement. (60 seconds max)
- Podcast: Audio show. (5-minute limit)
- *Powered by Adobe: A film created solely using Adobe tools. (5-minute limit)

Entry Questions

1. Brief synopsis/log line.
2. How did you come up with the concept for your video?
3. What are you most proud of in this production and why?
4. What process did you use to create this video (cameras, software, etc.)?

Credit Requirements

- Credits must be on screen for at least 5 seconds, either at the beginning or end of the video.
- Include video title, school, and all participants.
- List editing programs used.
- Cite all sources for copyrighted material using MLA.



Copyright Rules

- Copyright violations will result in disqualification.
- Up to 10% of the video may include copyrighted images (e.g., 5 min = 50 sec).
- All non-original images must be cited in MLA format.
- Copyrighted video or YouTube clips are NOT allowed.
- Satire, likeness, and names (e.g., Marvel fan fiction) are allowed.
- LEGO animations are permitted.
- Only copyright-free music or music with written permission is allowed.
- List music sources in credits with URL and track name.

- Rules and guidelines are subject to change. Updates will be communicated.
- Entries must be completed by the due date. No late entries accepted.
- Awards Ceremony details will be announced before the deadline.
- Judging rubric is included below and may be updated.

PCSFF Judging Rubric Template

This rubric is used to evaluate student film submissions for the Pinellas County Student Film Festival (PCSFF). Each category is scored from 1 (Needs Improvement) to 5 (Excellent). Judges should select the score that best represents the quality of the entry in each category.
