- 4. Stay relaxed if you begin to get nervous take a few deep breaths slowly to relax yourself and then get back to work.
- 5. Read the directions slowly and carefully.

Growing Friendships! Social skills are a set of skills used in social interactions that assist a person in communicating with others in a meaningful way. Social skills are closely related to Emotional intelligence, which involves the ability to perceive, assess, and positively influence one's own emotions along with other people's emotions. In order for relationships to bloom, people need to be able to monitor and control their own emotional state. Once this skill is acquired, you may be surprised at how your friendship garden has grown.

- Teach your child to use "I statements" when in conflict ~ " I feel _____, when you _____, so please_____".
- Teach your child to look like a friend by smiling.
- Help your child understand the concept of boundaries, respecting space, and ensuring that others are respecting their boundaries.
