Cycle 2 Map Testing Has Begun!!

The winter session of MAP testing opens on December 1. Our scholars K-5th grades will take a MAP[®] Growth test from NWEA on a computer. We give students MAP Growth tests to determine their instructional level and to measure academic growth throughout the school year (and from year to year) in Math and Reading.

MAP Growth tests are unique in that they adapt to your child's level of learning. If your child answers a question correctly, the next question is more challenging. If they answer incorrectly, the next one is easier. This results in a detailed picture of what your child knows and is ready to learn—whether it is on, above, or below their grade level.

Since MAP Growth tests provide immediate and accurate information about your child's learning, it's easy for teachers to identify students with similar scores that are generally ready for instruction in similar skills and topics, and then plan instruction accordingly.

MAP Growth reports also provide typical growth data for students who are in the same grade, subject, and have the same starting performance level. Please encourage your scholar to do their very best on this very important assessment.

Parents, your help is needed to ensure your child reaches their academic potential! Research shows that students who miss more school than their peers consistently score lower on standardized tests, regardless of their age and demographic group. In addition, academic success

in middle school and high school is directly related to how successful the student is during their elementary years. There are multiple resources available if you have barriers to getting your student to school. Please reach out to the school social workers or administration for help.



18 OR MORE DAYS

- Excused and unexcused absences represent lost time in the classroom and lost opportunities to learn.
- Missing just one day every two weeks can add up to 18 days in a year. Absences add up before you even know it.



10 TO 17 DAYS

- Students who are absent an average of 15 days a year miss a year's worth of school before their senior year.
- When students miss a day of school it actually puts them two days behind their classmates.



9 OR FEWER ABSENCES

- Students with good attendance generally achieve higher grades and enjoy school more.
- Children benefit and make the most of their educational opportunities if they attend school regularly and on time.
