### SIMPLE STRATEGIES FOR CREATING STRONG READERS



Without doubt, reading with early literacy. Putting a few simple strategies into action will make a significant difference in helping children develop into good readers and

writers. Through reading aloud, providing print materials, and promoting positive attitudes about reading and writing, you can have a powerful impact on children's literacy and learning.

- Invite a child to read with you every day.
- When reading a book where the print is large, point word by word as you read. This will help the child learn | • that reading goes from left to right and understand that the word he or she says is the word he or she sees.
- Read a child's favorite book over and over again.
- Read many stories with rhyming words and lines that repeat. Invite the child to join in on these parts. Point, word by word, as he or she reads along with you.
- Discuss new words. For example, "This big house is called a palace. Who do you think lives in a palace?"
- Stop and ask about the pictures and about what is happening in the story.
- Read from a variety of children's books, including fairy tales, song books, poems, and information books.

Reading well is at the heart of all learning. Children who can't read well, can't learn. Help make a difference for a child.

### **MATH FACTS**

The Math Florida Standards (MAFS) have a standard at each grade level regarding fluency. Math Fact fluency is defined as having efficient,



flexible and accurate methods for computing. A key idea to note is that it does not say to compute using paper and penchildren spells success for cil methods. Students need to be fluent in mental math, paper and pencil methods and using technology. In fact, an often overlooked and underdeveloped aspect of math fact fluency is being able to compute in all three ways, and knowing which method is best based on a given task. In addition, students must be able to determine if an exact answer or a close approximation (estimate) is sufficient.

> The Math facts your child should work on for mastery by the end of the year are as follows:

- Kindergarten: addition and subtraction within 5
- First Grade: addition within 20 and subtraction within 10
- Second Grade: addition and subtraction within 20 using mental strategies.
- Third Grade: multiplication and division within 100
- Fourth Grade: fluently add and subtract multi-digit whole numbers using the standard algorithm
- Fifth Grade: fluently multiply multi-digit whole numbers using the standard algorithm
