Hello Campbell Park Families,

FSA Testing is just around the corner. Online test tips for each of the FSA exams can be found on the Florida Standards Assessments website (www.fsassessments.org). The FSA website features computer-based math, reading, and writing training tests for each grade level, complete with answer keys and instructions.

Students who complete practice tests can determine which subject areas would benefit from some additional study time. They can also get acquainted with the question formats and response tools they'll see on test day. Math test prep materials on the FSA website include tutorials that can get students extra practice working with the response tools found in the math exams. Study.com also has courses tailored to FSA math tests as well as study guides. Please encourage your students to work hard and do their best!

School Psychologist Says...

TAKE THE TIME TO MAKE THE TIME!

Time Flies! Before we know it our children are all grown up and off to college. Most parents realize the rewards of close family ties. Yet the demands of jobs and day to day household activities can be stressful and tiring. Sometimes quality time with your child gets squeezed out. In this age of two-income families and working mothers, spending quality time with your child may seem impossible. Have demanding work schedules and endless housework taken over your life? Spending quality time with your child gives you a chance to shape their values. The shared experiences you have with your child will shape their viewpoints as they are exposed to the growing influence of peers and pop culture in the future. You provide a framework of reference points that your child may constantly refer to as they mature. The more time you spend with your child the more you will be able to help them tune into their abilities, skill building activities and healthy friendships. In order to find the time for your child try to prioritize and reorganize your schedule.



IMPROVING ATTENDANCE

In an effort to improve school attendance we are making some changes to our current tier 1 attendance interventions and processes. The first change we will be making is with the distribution of the student's daily dojo points. Students will still be able to earn 10 points daily, however the very first point of the day will be earned by students being present and on time. Therefore students in their seat by 8:45 will earn 1 point. Exceptions will be made to students arriving late from breakfast or with any other extreme circumstance (ex: being homeless, extreme weather, etc) Please let the social worker, Mr. McClain know of any situations. He can provide resources and support to help get our kids get to school.

Students with perfect attendance will be eligible for weekly, monthly, and yearly prizes. The weekly prize will be time in the Rays room. Every Monday afternoon two students with perfect attendance from each grade level will be randomly chosen to spend time in the Rays room. Game time will take place the following morning (Tuesday) from 8:30 to 9:15. Teachers will be notified of the winners by that Monday. Monthly prizes will consist of gifts cards and other prizes. The yearly prizes will be given as "family" prizes such as Rays tickets or Busch gardens tickets.
