It is amazing to think we are approaching the half way point in our school year. Seems like October has absolutely flown by. As we look forward to the upcoming holiday season, I am truly thankful to serve a fantastic school community where we have the best scholars, wonderful families, loving staff and incredible teachers. All stakeholders working together will help us take steps towards achieving our goals of 100% student success. One step you can take to help us reach our school goals, is to first know what our school's goals are:

- ⇒ Our goal for English Language Arts (ELA) is 45% percent of our scholars will be proficient and 65% of our scholars will make learning gains as measured by the Florida Standards Assessment (FSA).
- ⇒ For mathematics, our goal is 45% percent of our scholars will be proficient and 75% of our scholars will make learning gains as measured by FSA.

Also, it is vital for each parent/guardian to know your child's progress toward these goals. Presently, every Campbell Park teacher is having data chats with their classes to help scholars under-

stand his/her current performance and set growth goals.

How you can help your child grow academically? By engaging in your child's learning and attending parent teacher conferences so that you can support learning at home! **Please plan to attend our first Student Led Conference on November 14th at 6:00 p.m.** This night will be special as <u>your</u> child will lead the conference, sharing with you his/her progress. Attendance!!

1. An estimated 5 million to 7.5 million U.S. students miss nearly a month of school each year.

2. Absenteeism and its ill effects start early. One in 10 kindergarten and first grade students are chronically absent. Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of third grade or be held back.

3. By 6th grade, chronic absence becomes a leading indicator that a student will drop out of high school.

4. Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school, or about 18 days in most school districts, negatively affects a student's academic performance. That's just **two days a month** and that's known as chronic absenteeism.

- If your child misses school 2 days per month, by the time they leave elementary school, they have lost over ½ year of education (60% of one total school year).
- If you child misses 3 days per month, by the time they leave elementary school they have lost almost a year's worth of education (90% of one total school year). Help your child succeed, ensure they attend school daily.
