Folk-Style Worm Composting

<u>Setting up your earthworm bin</u> - Types of bins, types of medium, types of food, moisture level, and setting up your own bin

<u>Harvesting castings & long term care</u> — Harvesting castings from an established bin, the dos and don'ts of raising earthworms, and harvesting leachate (worm juice)
